#### 15 TREFRIW VILLAGE ENHANCEMENTS / GWELLIANNAU I BENTREF

- a. TCC to discuss Village speed limit, Road Signage within the Village and surrounding areas, County Councillor Jones email and prior discussions. Council to agree a course of action and agree date if agreed of Public Meeting. Much discussion regarding the email from Vic Turner (Traffic Network Manager for CBCC) which states guite clearly that the criteria for 20mph speed limit is not met in the village. In order to fund a larger scheme, we would require capital funding from the Welsh Government. As I've pointed out, the Welsh Government funding for such schemes is only likely to be awarded where there is a history of collisions that have resulted in casualties. Unfortunately, but realistically, we won't be able to deliver a 20mph with traffic calming scheme at this location.. Ts raised traffic calming methods which could be used - speed bumps, signs and police dummies etc. Ly made the point that ifs we held a public meeting we would need to be clear that speed limit looks extremely unlikely and that traffic calming may be the way forward.. Mk related that there are many mixed feelings regarding lowering speed limits in the village probably a 50:50 split for and aginst. All agreed that we should hold a public meeting to air and discuss the issues openly.
- b. Council to receive update re provision of dog waste bins on Gowers Road with Llanrwst Town Council See email in Supp items. Clerk had requested that CBCC empty 2 new dog waste bins provided by TCC on Gowers Road between the CBCC bins. CBCC replied: Unfortunately the Authority does not have the capacity to empty any new dog bins. Other Community councils have installed such bins, and service themselves by transferring the contents to existing street bins. Mk raised the health and environmental issues of dumping dog waste in general litter bins. Dn said that it would take 5 minutes maximum to empty the new bins as they were between bins already emptied by CBCC. Ts said that we could always object to the decision - most members agreed.
- c. Council to receive updates re Play Equipment in Village Playground - See email in Supp items County Cllr Jones to update Council on funding possibilities as per September **Meeting.** CBCC stance on the matter had not changed (no money available for repair or replacement of play equipment) however a recent email from Bryn Shiland CBCC suggested that if the broken items or barriers presented a risk - then CBCC would remove them. Mk said that he had just seen steel barrier upturned and obviously passing a risk to anyone using the play park. It was suggested by Lny that we get back to CBCC and request that as a matter of urgency the items and barriers be removed - all members agreed.
- d. Update re War Memorial refurbishment / clean and repair Project ongoing, completion and return to site 22/10/2018 for repairs and reguilding. - Chair referred to the recent email for TCC clerk itemising the repairs the extra work identified during the inspection is as follows: The company can complete the repair but the process will be timely and cost an additional £423 above the price quoted. Also whilst on site they have identified that the pinnacle on the top of the memorial is damaged large crack which is clearly visible which we knew about and they believe should be repaired at a cost of £875 or by replacing the whole top section at a cost of £1565. Dn raised the issue of just doing temporary repairs and then having to spend more money later. All agreed as did the residents. A resident raised the possibility of having a separate split panel with the names of the fallen engraved on - this had apparently been discussed in the past. Lny thought that was a good idea but shouldn't delay getting the lettering and replacement completed. Ly suggested that the Slate memorials be considered at a later date. It was decided that as we have reserves available it would be prudent to get the work completed - hopefully before the 11th Nov

Ts said it was his understanding from the TCC meeting of 4th Sept that the meeting with the professionals would not be for residents but that TCC councillors should attend. All other members agreed that was the case. Chair said that there was a misunderstanding and poor communication. Chair said that he could have handled it better but again thought he was saving others wasting their time...All councillors felt that at least a couple of councillors and or residents should have been present to observe and contribute to the discussion and decision making. TCC will let the professionals involved that this will be the case at future meetings.
