

## Trefriw Community Council Biodiversity Plan 2025/26

Trefriw Community Council (TCC) is committed to playing its part in protecting and enhancing biodiversity (the variety of life found on earth) and reversing its decline. We will also take action to protect our broader environment, including aligning with the principles set out in the One Voice Wales / Friends of the Earth Cymru 'Tackling Climate Chaos' guide for town and community councils (2023). This Biodiversity & Environmental Plan includes the actions which will be taken across all the Council's functions to achieve this.

### Biodiversity actions (for reporting as per Section 6 Environment (Wales) Act 2016)

Background for reporting: TCC serves two rural wards in Conwy County: Trefriw and Llanrhychwyn. TCC is responsible for the management of Trefriw cemetery, a small parcel of land on Wood Bank (known locally as Top Road), and Trefriw Trail 1 (adjacent to Gower Road). In addition, TCC is responsible for arranging the footpath maintenance in respect of the other Trefriw Trails around the village.
